

What is President's Forum?

Presidents' Forum was established in 1991 in Rockwood and is designed to facilitate collaboration, networking and an exchange of ideas among Rockwood PTO presidents.

- Presidents' Forum offers opportunities for meaningful communication between presidents and district administrators.
- Members meet regularly to discuss such topics as fundraising, parent involvement, district objectives and community-building activities.
- Presidents' Forum is organized and separately incorporated in accordance with Section 501(c)(3) of the IRS code in order to serve as the financial umbrella organization for PTOs.

Bylaws and Standing Rules

Bylaws are written and reviewed every two years by the Presidents' Forum. PTOs use this as a template for their bylaws. There are limited areas they can change to help adjust for their school. (Bylaws committee reviews every two years)

Standing Rules are tailored to fit the needs of the school and their operational year.







Monthly meetings throughout the school year

- Locations rotate to different elementary and middle schools;
 - High Schools rotate hosting the conference
- Students and principal are part of the welcome;
- Executive board determines topics based on annual survey of presidents and key district initiatives;
- Expectation that each school has representation at each meeting - typically PTO president;
- Board members are encouraged to attend as many monthly meetings as possible.

- The conference rotates annually among the four high schools and serves as a place for presidents and their executive boards to gather information from the district, district administrators, Presidents' Forum and fellow presidents on how to best run their PTO.

Fundraising

- PF doesn't fundraise it collects dues for food at the annual conference
- Help with fundraising ideas for PTOs by researching trends
- Help PTOs with appropriate money-handling procedures







Fundraising

- Rockwood PTOs regularly support their own families through Rockwood Gives Back and Got Your Back Pack, which provides weekly weekend meals for those who need it.
- Facilitates corporate match programs for PTOs
- Working together to improve profits by sharing experiences they have had with local businesses.







Importance of Checks and Balances

- Guidance to help maintain budget accuracy, compliance with the IRS and district policy.
- Given the tools to assist with
 - Internal audits
 - Bank reconciliations & financial statements
 - Document retention (four years)
 - Filing state and federal tax returns
 - Insurance coverage
 - District General Liability Coverage paid for by RSD
 - D&O (Directors and Officers), Contract Bond and Crime - Paid by PTO







- Meetings have changed as PTO needs have changed;
- The years of experience each PF Board member has helped the awareness of shifting needs and climate of PTOs;
- Ensures fiscal responsibility and consistency;
- Smoother transition with new school administration.







- Cultivates our PTO presidents as great district ambassadors.
- Very helpful avenue to inform and update about district initiatives:
 - Ballot measures
 - CSIP
 - Curriculum
 - Programs
- We have a large district, and PF helps connect our four quadrants.







- Providing a resource to help administrators and parents work together
 - Speaking the same language by teaching the PTOs through training - personal development
 - Mediation & conflict negotiations - The Essential Process of Mediation







- Advocacy regarding legislation that impacts schools;

- Brings together PTO leaders, district administrators, BOE;
- Building next generation of Board members.







Building Stronger Relationships with Administrators

- New Administrators
 - Set up procedures on how the school year will operate
- Current Administrators
 - Review treasurer and presidents' roles and practices
- Facilitate effective problem-solving early on to enhance communication and collaboration.

 - Relationship-driven and includes shared decision-making








Engagement - Doing With

Involvement is great but engagement is transformative.












